Dealing with Financial Issues Related to Metastatic Breast Cancer

Financial challenges can represent an additional hurdle for many people who are diagnosed with metastatic breast cancer.

The cost of treatment, making decisions about whether to continue working, and sorting through which expenses are covered through an insurance plan can be stressful. However, it is important not to panic or stop treatment. As you begin the journey of seeking financial assistance to help cover the cost of your medical care, consider talking to your health care providers, insurance provider and/or social worker for initial recommendations and to learn about additional resources.

As you consider your options, it will be important to keep in mind that there are organizations that can assist with decreasing the financial burden of metastatic breast cancer. This document is intended to provide both an overview of direct financial support resources, as well as recommendations for additional organizations to contact for more information.

Direct Resources for Financial Support: Health Facility/Insurance Assistance

Hill-Burton Free Care Program

Fifth Season Financial

Fifth Season Financial is a licensed consumer lender that provides people with advanced-stage illness an advance on the face value of their life insurance policy through the Loans for Living program. There are no out-of-pocket expenses or loan repayments required through this program, and insurance premiums become the responsibility of Fifth Season Financial. Loans of up to 60 percent can be granted for life insurance policies over \$75,000.

Medicaid provides health coverage to eligible low-income adults and is administered by your state, according to federal requirements. Contact your state Medicaid office to determine whether you qualify for the Breast & Cervical Cancer Prevention and Treatment Program, whether your state has a program for the medically needy, or if you qualify for another type of coverage.

CancerCare provides financial assistance grants for transportation to and from treatment for cancer.



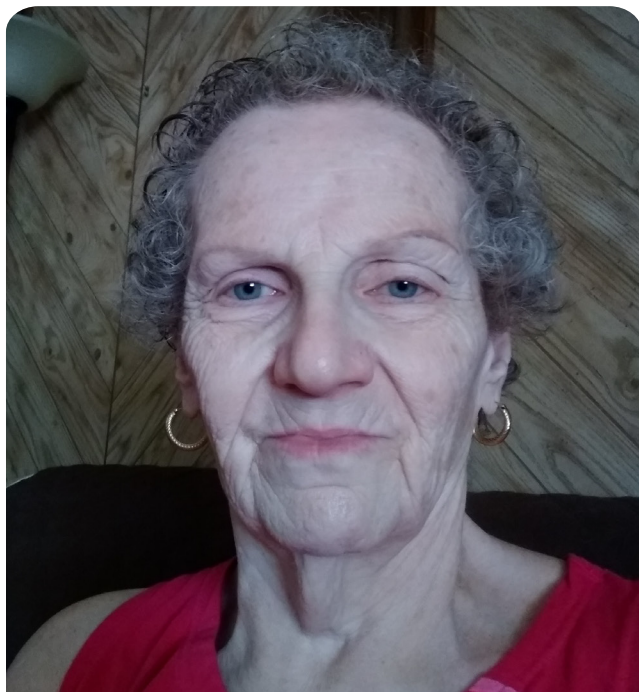
